Dear Ms. Golden:

Through another successful application of the Code Blue, Phase 4 project, Southern Region EMS Council will be purchasing equipment requested by Kachemak Emergency Services. Purchasing of these items should be completed in March. They are as follows:

- 1 Stryker Rugged Stair-Pro Chair
- 1 LifePak 12 Defibrillator/Monitor (reconditioned)

The community pledged a 10% match on each of these items. We were able to get 100% of the Stryker chair funded. The LifePak 12 was purchased at a savings of more than \$5,000 from that originally proposed, and will result in a much lower than anticipated community match. We expect the match to be about \$1,421, and will bill that when the purchase is finalized.

We are happy to be able to put these important items to work in the Borough, improving the provision of emergency medical services. We will provide stickers that that must be attached to the equipment indicating they were funded by the Code Blue Project. Don't hesitate to contact me if you have any questions.
