The Kenai Peninsula Borough School District (KPBSD) needs to provide housing for its teachers serving the Native Village of Tyonek. A parcel of land has been identified within the village and is being platted as Lot 82, Tyonek Teacher Housing Subdivision, according to KPB Preliminary Plat No. 2005-012. See attached location map, Exhibit A. The subject resolution authorizes a 40-year lease at an annual rental of \$1.00 per year with the Tyonek Native Corporation. The Native Village of Tyonek will provide utilities to Lot 82 that will be the responsibility of the KPBSD to pay.

Chairman Bryson opened the meeting for public comment. Seeing and hearing no one else wishing to speak, Chairman Bryson closed the public comment and opened the discussion among the Commission.

**MOTION:** Commissioner Gross moved, seconded by Commissioner Hohl to recommend approval of the Kenai Peninsula Borough Resolution 2005-(unnumbered) authorizing the lease of Lot 82 for Tyonek Teacher Housing.

Commissioner Clark asked if property taxes apply to this lot. Mr. Ostrander stated that property taxes do apply but at this point they are looking at getting an exception to that. As it is assessed at this time, it comes out to about \$10 per year. Commissioner Clark asked if there were improvements going on this property. Mr. Ostrander stated yes.
