ORDINANCE NO. 48

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED: AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE
COMPENSATION AND EXPENSES OF THE
BOROUGH CHAIRMAN AND ASSEMBLYMEN.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA
BOROUGH:

Section 1. Section 05.10.015 of the Code of Ordinances
of the Kenai Peninsula Borough is amended to read as follows:

Section 05.10.015. (a) Compensation of Assemblymen.
None.

(b) Per Diem Allowance. Assemblymen, while traveling
on official business or attending a regular or special
meeting of the assembly, shall be allowed, instead of
their actual expenses for subsistence, a per diem
allowance which shall be established according to the
distance the assemblyman is obliged to travel one way
to attend the meeting or perform the business as follows:

0	-	14.9 miles	-	\$25.00
15.0	-	64.9 miles	-	\$30.00
65.0	-	124.0 miles	-	\$35.00
125.0	-	miles or more	-	\$50.00

In addition, the expenses of air transportation will
be reimbursed at actual cost. In the event that air
travel is involved, the per diem will be based on
mileage from the home of the assemblyman to the point
of embarkation. Any meeting requiring overnight
lodging will be considered as two (2) days. Per diem
shall be allowed at the rate of \$25.00 for each day
in excess of the first day. In certain cases actual
expenses will be allowed.

(b) Expenses of assemblymen. All assemblymen shall
receive reimbursement for actual expenses incurred in
attending assembly meetings and performing other official
duties authorized by the assembly, such reimbursement
not to exceed \$25.00 a day for expenses specified in
05.010.015. (a) (2), except as approved by the assembly
on the basis of circumstances justifying costs above

the limit, reimbursement shall be on the following basis:

1. For travel, \$.12 a mile for use of privately owned vehicle, the common carrier fare or the cost of charter or other special hire, if essential in the public interest, taxi, airport limousine and other simialr fares as necessary for efficient performance of official duties.
2. For personal and incidental expenses, the cost of meals, lodging and similar expenses necessary to the efficient performance of official duties.

Section 2. Chapter 5 of Title 9 (KPB 9.05) of the Code of Ordinances of the Kenai Peninsula Borough is amended by adding a new section to be numbered 9.05.015, which said section reads as follows:

Section 9.05.015. Compensation of Borough Chairman.

(a) Salary. The borough chairman shall receive as compensation a sum of \$15,500 per year payable in equal monthly installments.

(b) Expenses. The chairman shall receive reimbursement for expenses incurred in the performance of official duties on the following basis:

1. While traveling on official business and away from the designated post of duty, the chairman shall be allowed, instead of his actual expenses for subsistence, a per diem allowance of not to exceed \$35.00 per day. In particular cases, the chairman, may upon proper documentation and assembly approval be allowed his actual expenses in excess of \$35.00 per day.

2. In addition to per diem, reimbursement for travel expenses shall be allowed at the following rate:

15 cents per mile for the use of a privately owned automobile.

Private automobiles shall be used only when borough automobiles are not available. When travel is by public carrier, the chairman will be allowed the

actual costs of the fare or charter rate, where charter is most advantageous to the borough, taxi, airport limousine, ferry fares, bridge, road and town tolls. Where two or more officials or employees are traveling in the same direction, and it is possible to share a privately-owned automobile or airplane, the mileage permitted shall be allowed only once. No reimbursement shall be allowed for more than the lowest tourist class fare for the most direct route unless (a) Tourist Class accommodation was not available; and (b) waiting for tourist class accommodation would occasion a delay harmful to the borough or (c) the chairman finds that travel by tourist class accommodation is not in the best interests of the borough.

Section 3. Section 05.10.010. of the Code of Ordinances of the Kenai Peninsula Borough is repealed.

Section 4. This ordinance becomes effective immediately upon its passage and approval according to law.
