ORDINANCE NO. 49

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE QUALIFICATIONS OF
BOROUGH ASSEMBLYMEN AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA
BOROUGH:

Section 1. Declaration of emergency. The assembly of the Kenai Peninsula Borough hereby finds and declares that an emergency exists affecting the welfare and property of the borough in that doubt and controversy regarding the qualifications of members of the assembly creates a potentially costly, litigious situation which may further impair the assembly in considering borough financial programs.

Section 2. If a city is newly incorporated or newly reorganized as a city of the first class, an assemblyman elected by the people living outside of first class cities, who is a resident of the newly incorporated or reorganized first class city, shall continue to serve as a representative of the people who originally elected him until the next general election.

If a vacancy occurs in the assembly through the resignation or removal of an assemblyman representing the population of the area outside first class cities and the population of the area of a newly incorporated or organized first class city, the assembly shall appoint his successor from among the same population.

Section 3. This ordinance takes effect immediately upon its adoption.
