ORDINANCE NO. 54

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED: AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO APPOR-
TIONMENT OF THE BOROUGH ASSEMBLY
AND TERM OF THE BOROUGH CHAIRMAN

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA
BOROUGH:

Section 1. Section 05.10.05 of the Code of Ordinances
of the Kenai Peninsula Borough is amended to read as follows:

"Section 05.10.05. Assembly: Election and Term.
(a) Outside First Class Cities. There shall be
eight (8) members of the Assembly representing the
area outside first class cities. They shall be
elected at large from the area outside first class
cities for staggered terms of three (3) years each.

(1) Starting with the general election of October, 1967:

One shall continue to serve out a term
expiring in 1968
One shall be elected to serve a term
expiring in 1968
Two shall continue to serve out terms
to which they were elected, expiring 1969
One shall be elected to fill the un-
expired portion of a term expiring in 1969
Three shall be elected for terms of
three years each expiring in 1970

Thereafter, as each term expires, it shall
be succeeded by another three (3) year term.

(2) The three (or two, in the case of terms expiring
in 1968 and successor terms) candidates receiving
the highest number of votes shall be elected as
members of the assembly.

(b) First Class Cities.

(1) Members of the Assembly from first class cities
shall be elected by and from the City Council of
the City involved for terms of three (3) years.
The number of assemblymen from first class cities

shall be as follows:

Homer	1
Kenai	2
Seldovia	1
Seward	2
Soldotna	1

- (2) For the first meeting of the assembly after the general election of October, 1967, the City Council of Seward and the City Council of Kenai shall each designate one representative as serving a three (3) year term and one as serving a one (1) year term. The representatives designated by Homer, Seldovia and Soldotna, shall, at the first meeting, draw lots among themselves to determine which one of them shall serve a one (1) year term. The others shall serve two (2) year terms. Thereafter, as the term of each assemblyman from a first class city expires, his successor shall be elected by the City council for a term of three (3) years. The expiration of the term of office of a member of a city council who also serves as a borough assemblyman shall not create a vacancy on the borough assembly unless the assemblyman fails of re-election to the city council."

Section 2. Section 9.05 of the Code of Ordinances of the Kenai Peninsula Borough is amended by adding a new section to be numbered Section 9.05.01 to read as follows:

"Section 9.05.01. Term. The term of office of the Chairman is three (3) years."

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
