ORDINANCE NO. 72-11

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO ELECTIONS"

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA  
BOROUGH:

Section 1. Sec. 11.10.010 of the Kenai Peninsula Borough  
Code of Ordinances is amended to read:

Sec. 11.10.010. Qualifications of Voters. A person  
may vote in an election who:

- (1) is a citizen of the United States;
- (2) is at least 18 years of age;
- (3) has been a resident of Alaska for 75  
days and of the borough for 30 days  
immediately prior to the election;
- (4) has not been judicially determined to  
be of unsound mind unless the disability  
has been removed;
- (5) has not been convicted of a felony  
involving moral turpitude unless his  
civil rights have been restored;
- (6) is registered with the State of Alaska  
as a voter in the precinct in which he  
resides. No registration will be made for  
a period of 30 days prior to an election.

Section 2. Sec. 11.05.020 is repealed and reenacted to  
read:

Sec. 11.05.020. Runoff Election. (a) If no candidate  
for the office of borough chairman receives a majority  
of the votes cast for that office, a runoff election  
between the two candidates receiving the highest number  
of votes will be held on the third Tuesday following the  
regular election or within two weeks after certification  
of the results of the election.

(b) If no candidate for the office of assemblyman or school board member receives in excess of 40 percent of the votes cast for his respective office, a runoff election shall be held on the third Tuesday following the regular election or within two weeks after certification of the results of the election. When more than one assembly or school board vacancy is to be filled and the seats are not designated, total votes cast for a respective office shall be determined by dividing the total number of votes cast for all candidates by the number of vacancies for the position.

(c) In the event a runoff is required, the number of candidates receiving the highest votes to provide two candidates for each vacancy shall be included in the list of candidates for the runoff election.

Section 3. Sec. 11.05.030. Notice of Election (c) is amended to read:

Sec. 11.05.030. Notice of Election. (c) Notice of a runoff election shall be published at least five days before the election.

Section 4. Sec. 11.35.020 is repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance takes effect thirty days after enactment.
