ORDINANCE 75-41

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING KPC 25.10.05 TO REDUCE THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH SALES TAX FROM 3% TO 2%

WHEREAS, it appears that the financial condition of the Kenai Peninsula Borough is such that a reduction in taxes can be made without interfering with any essential services; and

WHEREAS, continuous inflation makes it more and more difficult for citizens of the borough to maintain their standard of living; and

WHEREAS, the tax reduction which would give the broadest relief to all citizens of the borough would be a reduction in sales tax on all retail sales, rents, and services within the borough; Now Therefore,


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1: KPC 25.10.05 is hereby amended as follows:


There is levied a consumers' sales tax of two [THREE] percent on all retail sales, on all rents, and on all services made or rendered within the Borough, measured by the gross sales price of the seller.

Section 2: This ordinance shall become effective October 1, 1975.
