KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH

ORDINANCE 75-62

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$10,000 FROM FEDERAL REVENUE SHARING TRUST FUND FOR ARCHITECTURAL OR ENGINEERING FEES FOR COMPLETION OF INTERIOR OF THIRD FLOOR OF THE BOROUGH OFFICE BUILDING OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH.

WHEREAS, it may become necessary in the near future to expand borough offices to the unfinished third floor of the borough building or, in the alternative, to move the administrative offices of the Kenai Peninsula Borough School District to the third floor; and

WHEREAS, AS 35.10.015 requires that construction of public facilities by political subdivisions of the state are accessible to, and usable by, the physically handicapped, which with respect to the third floor of the borough headquarters building would require an installation of an elevator; and

WHEREAS, there may be other federal or state requirements that must be met in completing said third floor; and

WHEREAS, there are moneys available in federal revenue sharing trust fund which could be used for the purpose of the construction of these facilities, including architectural or engineering planning therefor; Now Therefore,


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. The amount of \$10,000 is hereby appropriated from the Federal Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for architectural, engineering, or architectural and engineering fees for drafting plans for completion of the interior of the third floor of the borough building incorporating the federal or state safety or other requirements for public buildings, such as installation of elevators, and specifically including plans for construction of an elevator to serve all three floors of the borough building.


Section 2. This ordinance shall become effective on the day of enactment.
