ORDINANCE 76- 23

AN ORDINANCE TO REQUIRE THE SCHOOL BOARD TO TRANSMIT TO THE ASSEMBLY ONCE A MONTH A SUMMARY REPORT AND STATEMENT OF MONEYS EXPENDED.

WHEREAS, the Assembly of the Kenai Peninsula Borough is keenly interested in the school system of the Kenai Peninsula; and

WHEREAS, the Kenai Peninsula Borough supports the school district with considerable moneys each year; and

WHEREAS, the Kenai Peninsula Borough administers a sales tax whose revenues are dedicated to school purposes; and

WHEREAS, AS 14.14.090 (4) provides "[that the duties of the school board are to] transmit, when required by the assembly or council but not more often than once a month, a summary report and statement of money expended;" Now Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

That the Kenai Peninsula Borough Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by adding a new section to be numbered 5.08.060 which shall read as follows:

Section 1. "5.08.060. School District Expenditure Report. That the School District of the Kenai Peninsula Borough shall submit monthly,

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at the first regular meeting in each month of the Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly, a summary report and statement of all moneys expended by the district for the preceding month, which shall include the budgeted amounts, as compared to actual expenditures."

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

Sec. 14.14.090. Additional duties. In addition to other duties, a school board shall

- (1) determine and disburse the total amount to be made available for compensation of all school employees and administrative officers;
- (2) provide for, during the school term of each year, an educational program for each school age child who is a resident of the district;
- (3) withhold the salary for the last month of service of a teacher or administrator until the teacher or administrator has submitted all summaries, statistics, and reports which the school board may require by bylaw;
- (4) transmit, when required by the assembly or council but not more often than once a month, a summary report and statement of money expended;
- (5) keep the minutes of meetings and a record of all proceedings of the school board in a pertinent form;
- (6) keep the records and files of the school board open to inspection by the public at the principal administrative office of the district during reasonable business hours. (§ 1 ch 98 SLA 1966)
