KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH

ORDINANCE 76-55

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION OF \$76,000 FROM THE SURPLUS FUNDS OF THE BOROUGH FOR THE PURCHASE OF TWO MOBILE STRUCTURES TO HOUSE SCHOOL DISTRICT PERSONNEL AT TYONEK DURING THE 1976-1977 SCHOOL YEAR.

WHEREAS, the public schools in Tyonek resumed classes on September 1, 1976; and

WHEREAS, housing facilities are not available for teachers assigned to Tyonek; and

WHEREAS, the lack of housing and the necessity to proceed with the school program constitutes an emergency requiring immediate attention; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance is an emergency measure to accomplish an immediate solution on a temporary basis; Now Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized to expend \$76,000 to purchase no more than two mobile structures for temporary housing purposes suitable for accommodating school district personnel at Tyonek, including incidental expenses to connect public utilities and sanitary facilities to such structures for residence purposes.

Section 2. This authorization includes any necessary expenses to construct pads or any other related facilities essential to equipping for residential use, and costs of shipping or transportation.

Section 3. That the sum of \$76,000 is hereby appropriated for the purpose of effectuating Sections 1 and 2 of this ordinance.

Section 4. The assembly finds that the lack of housing for teachers at Tyonek constitutes an emergency.

Section 5. This ordinance takes effect on the day of enactment.
