ORDINANCE 78-33

AN ORDINANCE TO REDUCE THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH SALES TAX FROM 2% TO 0%

WHEREAS, it appears that the financial condition of the Kenai Peninsula Borough is such that a reduction in taxes can be made without interfering with any essential services; and

WHEREAS, continuous inflation makes it more and more difficult for citizens of the borough to maintain their standard of living; and

WHEREAS, the tax reduction which would give the broadest relief to all citizens of the borough would be a reduction in sales tax on all retail sales, rents, and services within the borough;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. Section 5.16.020 of the Borough Code of ordinances is amended to read:

There is levied a consumers' sales tax of zero (0) [2] percent on all retail sales, on all rents, and on all services made or rendered within the borough, measured by the gross sales price of the seller.

Section 2. This reduction is effective through June 30, 1980.

Section 3. This ordinance shall become effective October 1, 1978, and does not affect sales taxes enacted by cities within the Borough.
