KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH

ORDINANCE 80-65

AMENDING SECTION 2.08.120 OF THE BOROUGH CODE SETTING OUT THE ORDER OF BUSINESS OF THE ASSEMBLY AND ADDING AN INVOCATION

WHEREAS, the legislative bodies of both the U.S. and the State of Alaska begin daily sessions with an invocation; and

WHEREAS, members of the assembly have expressed a desire for an invocation at the start of the meeting;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the present Section 2.08.120 of the Borough Code is amended to read:

- A. Call to order [AND ROLL CALL]
- B. Pledge of allegiance
- C. Roll call [SEATING OF NEW ASSEMBLY MEMBERS]
- D. Invocation [APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS]
- E. Seating of new assembly members
- F. [D] Approval of minutes of previous meetings
- G. [E] Agenda approval
- H. [F] Public presentations upon matters not contained in the assembly's agenda for the meeting
- I. [L] Committee reports
- J. [G] Ordinance hearings or other public hearings

- K. [H] Consideration of resolutions
- L. [I] Pending legislation
- M. [J] Introduction of ordinances
- N. [K] Formal presentations with prior notice upon matters not on the meeting agenda
- O. [M] Mayor's report
- P. [N] Other business
- Q. [O] Assembly and Mayor's comments
- R. [P] Public comments
- S. [Q] Informational materials and reports
- T. [R] Notice of next meeting and adjournment

Section 2. That the Borough Code of ordinances is amended by adding a new section, to be number 2.08.160, which reads:

Section 2.08.160 Invocation. The President shall designate someone to offer a brief invocation at the start of the meeting.

Section 3. This ordinance takes effect immediately upon its enactment.
