KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH

ORDINANCE 81-119
(AMENDED)

ENACTING CHAPTER 18.04 OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF ORDINANCES TO PROVIDE FOR THE AWARD OF CONTRACTS AND PURCHASES OF SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT TO LOCAL RESIDENT BIDDERS IF THE BID IS NOT MORE THAN FIVE PERCENT (5%) HIGHER THAN THE LOWEST NON-RESIDENT BID.

WHEREAS, the Assembly finds that there is a basis for encouraging local industry and local businesses in the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough awards contracts for construction and repairs, and purchases of supplies, materials, equipment and contractual services after soliciting competitive bids; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly finds that local resident bidders should be given an economic adjustment in bid prices to compensate for the higher costs associated with construction in and on the Peninsula;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That Title 18, Chapter 18.04 is enacted to read:

Section 18.04.010. Competitive Bids--Local Bidders--Preference. A contract for construction and repairs, or a purchase of and contract for supplies, materials, equipment, and contractual services which are awarded on the basis of competitive bids, shall be awarded to a local resident bidder if the bid is not more than five percent (5%) than the lowest non-resident bid. A local resident bidder is a business which:

- A. Holds a current Alaska Business License;
- B. Submits a bid for goods or services under the name as appearing on the Alaska Business License;
- C. Has maintained a place of business within the Borough for a period of six months immediately preceding the date of the bid.

D. Is owned and operated by a resident of the Borough who has resided within the Borough for a period of six months immediately preceding the date of the bid.

This section shall not apply to contracts or purchases when it is in conflict with contract awards of the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities or the Department of Highways of the State of Alaska.

Section 2. This ordinance takes effect ninety [90] days after its enactment.
