KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH

ORDINANCE 81-16

PROVIDING FOR THE ACQUISITION OF MUNICIPAL POWERS NECESSARY TO PROVIDE SEWERS AND SEWAGE TREATMENT FACILITIES IN THE BOROUGH OUTSIDE CITIES.

WHEREAS, in recent years there has been a continuing discussion, interest, and consideration of the problem of disposing of septic wastes in available and adaptable locations in the Borough; and

WHEREAS, it is becoming increasingly apparent that industrial activity in the Borough requires the development of facilities to accommodate the needs of industry, including disposal of special industrial wastes; and

WHEREAS, the Borough continues to feel the pressure of a need to resolve this problem in the interests of public health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, this essential public service cannot be met or fully developed by any one particular private enterprise, but requires the full potential resources of the entire Borough;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the Assembly proposes the acquisition of the additional municipal power to provide sewers and sewage treatment facilities in the area outside cities. The Borough shall seek to have the identical power transferred from cities within the Borough, or propose joint Borough-city exercise of the power, before exercising this power outside cities only.

Section 2. The Assembly shall hold at least one public hearing in the Borough on the question. The Assembly shall then evaluate the ability of the Borough to exercise the powers and make its findings public.

Section 3. The Assembly shall, within 30 days after its findings have been made public, order an election on the question in the Borough area outside cities. The election shall be held at the next regular election.

Section 4. This ordinance takes effect immediately upon its enactment.
