KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH

ORDINANCE 81-75

ESTABLISHING A CENTRAL PENINSULA EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE AND AMBULANCE SERVICES AREA.

WHEREAS, the Borough Clerk has been presented with a petition requesting the Assembly to provide emergency medical and ambulance services within the boundaries of a new service area which includes the voting precincts of Tustumena, Kalifonsky, Sterling, Ridgeway, Soldotna 1 and Soldotna 2; and

WHEREAS, areas within a first class city may not be included in a Borough services area unless the city council first transfers its power to provide the contemplated services to the service area; and

WHEREAS, the Clerk has determined that the initiative petition contains sufficient signatures, whether or not the area within the city of Soldotna is included in the proposed service area; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly finds that the emergency medical services and ambulance services contemplated by the proposed service area are needed within the Tustumena, Kalifonsky, Sterling, and Ridgeway voting precincts and that such services can best be provided by the establishment of a service area of the Borough, because such services cannot be provided by an existing service area, by annexation to a city or by incorporation; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of any service area must be approved by a majority of those persons voting within the proposed service area;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. There is hereby established, subject to approval by a vote of the people, a Central Peninsula Emergency Medical Service and Ambulance Service Area within that portion of the Borough described as all lands lying within the boundaries of the Tustumena, Kalifonsky, Sterling and Ridgeway election precincts as established by the Lieutenant Governor of the State of Alaska as of July 1, 1981. No mill levy in excess of one mill shall be levied on behalf of the service area

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unless an increase is approved by a majority vote of the voters at an election within the service area.

Section 2. In the event that the city of Soldotna requests inclusion in the proposed service area by September 4, 1981, and agrees to transfer emergency medical services and ambulance powers to any newly formed service area, then the area encompassed by the Central Peninsula Emergency Medical Services and Ambulance Service Area shall include all lands lying within Soldotna Election Precinct No. 1 and Soldotna Election Precinct No. 2.

Section 3. The Clerk shall place a proposition upon the ballot of those precincts included in the proposed Central Peninsula Emergency Medical Services and Ambulance Service Area at the next regular Borough election of October 6, 1981, for the purpose of approving or disapproving the establishment of the service area and for the election of a five member service area board. The proposition to be placed upon the ballot within the proposed service area shall read:

PROPOSITION: Shall the Central Peninsula Emergency Medical Service and Ambulance Service Area be established within the area encompassed by the Tustumena, Kalifon-sky, Ridgeway, and Sterling (Soldotna No. 1 and Soldotna No. 2) Election Precincts for the purpose of providing emergency medical services and ambulance services to the residents of the service area, with a mill levy not to exceed one mill?

Section 3. At the same election, there will be elected a five member board of directors to serve in the event that the service area is approved and for the purpose of such election, candidates shall file for specific seats designated A, B, C, D, and E, to be elected at large. The terms of office for each such seat shall be as follows:

- A. Three years
- B. Three years
- C. Two years for the initial term and three years for each subsequent term.

- D. Two years for the initial term and three years for each subsequent term.
- E. One year for the initial term and three years for each subsequent term.

A candidate for any office specified in this ordinance must be a qualified voter of the proposed service area and must be nominated by a petition signed by ten qualified voters of the proposed service area. Nomination petitions must be filed with the Borough Clerk prior to 4:30 p.m., September 4, 1981, at the Borough Office, Soldotna, Alaska. A person named in the nomination petition must sign on the petition the following statement:

"I hereby accept the above nomination and agree to serve if elected."

Any person who has been a resident of the proposed service area for 30 days immediately preceding the election and who is a registered voter in that precinct may vote upon the question.

Section 4. In the event that the establishment of the service area is approved by a vote of the people, then the Assembly shall by ordinance provide for the organization and operation of the service area and shall establish the powers and duties of the directors.

Section 5. That if the ballot proposition establishing the service area is approved by a majority of those persons voting within the precincts comprising the proposed service area, then this ordinance shall take effect at 12:01 a.m., on the date following certification of the election by the Borough Assembly.
