KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH

ORDINANCE 82-77 (REVISED)

ESTABLISHING THE ANCHOR POINT FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICE AREA TO PROVIDE FIRE PROTECTION AND AMBULANCE SERVICES, AND PROVIDING FOR AN ELECTED BOARD.

WHEREAS, two public hearings were held by an assembly committee on August 11 and September 2, 1982, at the Anchor Point Community Hall to determine the necessity for this service area; and

WHEREAS, assembly members found sufficient interest in the community in these services to justify an election on the question; and

WHEREAS, such services cannot be provided by an existing service area, by annexation to a city, or by incorporation as a city;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. Title 16 of the Kenai Peninsula Borough Code of ordinances is amended by addition of this chapter:

CHAPTER 16.48. ANCHOR POINT FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICE AREA:

Section 16.48.010 Boundaries. There is hereby established a service area within the borough designated the "Anchor Point Fire and Emergency Service Area", in that portion of the borough described as follows:

All lands and waters within the Anchor Point Election Precinct easterly of the westerly mean high water line of Cook Inlet.

Section 16.48.020. Board of Directors. (a) There is hereby established a board of directors for the Anchor Point Fire and Emergency Service Area composed of five (5) members who shall be nominated and elected by the qualified voters of the service area in the manner provided for candidates for assembly in the borough Code of ordinances, except that members of the board shall be residents of the borough within the service area.

(b) The board shall meet periodically at regular and special meetings called by the board. All meetings shall be open to the public as provided by law.

Section 16.48.030. Terms and Qualifications. (a) A member of the board of directors shall be elected for a term of three (3) years and shall serve until his successor has been elected and sworn to assume the duties of the office, except that the first board shall contain staggered terms as designated in the resolution providing for the election.

Section 16.48.040. Powers and Duties. The board of directors of the service area, subject to assembly approval, and appropriation of funds, shall supervise the fire and emergency services within the service area and shall advise the mayor and the assembly concerning the administration and operation of the service area.

Section 16.40.050 Mill Levy. No mill levy in excess of 2 mills shall be levied on behalf of the service area unless an increase is approved by a majority vote of the voters at an election within the service area.

Section 2. In the event that the service area is approved by the voters in the service area, the assembly shall enact an ordinance providing for the organization and the rules and regulations to govern the service area.

Section 3. That this ordinance takes effect immediately upon its enactment, and upon approval by the voters of the service area.
