ORDINANCE 85-6

AMENDING KPB 2.40.100 C. TO PROVIDE FOR THE BOROUGH RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION TO SERVE AS OVERALL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM COMMITTEE FOR THE PURPOSES OF MAINTAINING ELIGIBILITY FOR ASSISTANCE UNDER THE PUBLIC WORKS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ACT OF 1965.

WHEREAS, the Kenai Peninsula Borough and the communities within the Borough are qualified for assistance under the federal Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965 due to the Borough's annual high rates of unemployment and underemployment; and

WHEREAS, to be eligible for assistance under this legislation qualified areas are required to maintain an Overall Economic Development Program as a responsibility of a duly designated OEDP Committee; and

WHEREAS, it is the function of an OEDP Committee to be the principal coordinator for the various activities undertaken locally to stimulate new permanent employment and growth opportunities in the area; and

WHEREAS, the makeup and function of the Kenai Peninsula Borough's Resource Development Commission is such that it is easily adaptable to assuming the functions of an OEDP Committee in addition to it's existing responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, it is considered in the best interests of the development needs of the borough and its communities to retain eligibility under the Public Works and Economic Development Act;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That KPB 2.40.100 C. be amended by the addition of a subsection 8. which is hereby enacted to read:

8. The Commission shall additionally serve as Overall Economic Development Program Committee for purposes of coordinating development programs on a peninsula wide basis and performing all functions and providing such reports as are necessary for the purposes of maintaining eligibility for assistance under the Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment.

ORDINANCE 85-7

AMENDING KPB 10.10 PERTAINING TO THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH CODE OF ORDINANCES TO PROVIDE FOR CITY APPOINTMENTS TO THE WASTE DISPOSAL COMMISSION AT CITY EXPENSE.

WHEREAS, it appears that the cities may be affected by waste disposal alternatives in a manner differently from people residing outside of cities; and

WHEREAS, the cities should have the opportunity of equal representation on the Waste Disposal Commission;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH;

Section 1. That KPB 10.10.020 is amended to read as follows:

10.10.020 Waste Disposal Commission. A. There is created a Kenai Peninsula Borough Waste Disposal Commission which shall be comprised of five District representatives and five City representatives.

B. The borough planning director shall be an exofficio member of the commission who shall be entitled to vote only as necessary to break a tie.

Section 2. That KPB 10.10.050 is amended to read as follows:

10.10.050 Waste disposal [AREA] representatives
--Appointment--Terms of office. A. [THE COMMISSION SHALL CONSIST OF FIVE MEMBERS.] The Borough Mayor shall appoint one Waste Disposal Commission District representative from each Assembly district, and one District member at large, who if available, shall be a registered professional engineer or a person who has direct professional or work experience with solid waste disposal. The appointments will be subject to ratification of the Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly.

1.[B] The term of office for a District Waste Disposal Commission representative shall be for a period of three years; except for initial appointees who shall be appointed as follows: one for a one-year term; two appointed for a two-year term; and two appointed for a three-year term.

B. One City Waste Disposal Commission representative may be appointed pursuant to ordinance of the cities of Homer, Kenai, Seldovia, Seward, and Soldotna.

1. The term of office for a City Waste Disposal Commission representative shall be for a period of not to exceed three years as established by ordinance of the respective city.

C. A chairman and vice chairman of the Commission shall be selected annually from and by the appointed members of the Commission.

10.10.060 Expenses. A. District Waste Disposal Commission members shall be allowed per diem and travel expenses as provided for Borough employees.

B. City Waste Disposal Commission members may be allowed benefits and reimbursements from city funds as authorized by ordinance of the respective city.

Section 3. That this ordinance takes effect immediately upon its enactment.
