KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH
ORDINANCE 85-63 (SUBSTITUTE)

PLACING ON THE BALLOT AT THE REGULAR ELECTION OF OCTOBER 1986, THE QUESTION AS TO WHETHER SERVICE AREA BOARDS OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH SHALL BE EXEMPT FROM THE FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE LAW.

WHEREAS, the state law requires all candidates for borough elective offices to file reports concerning finances; and

WHEREAS, the state law requires municipal officers, including the mayor, assemblymen, school board members, members of the planning commission, but not service area boards, to file reports concerning finances; and

WHEREAS, service area boards serve without compensation other than mileage reimbursement; and

WHEREAS, there are many self employed residents of the peninsula for whom reporting each source of income becomes an undue hardship; and

WHEREAS, AS 39.50.145 provides that the voters may exempt municipal officers and elected officials of the borough from the filing of the conflict of interest statements; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly of the Kenai Peninsula Borough desires that the voters of the Borough be given the opportunity to decide whether or not the financial disclosure laws should be applicable to service area boards within the Borough;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That there shall be placed on the ballot for the regular borough election of October 7, 1986, the following proposition:

"Shall candidates for service area boards of the Kenai Peninsula Borough be exempt from all reporting and disclosure requirements of the Alaska Conflict of Interest Law (AS 39.50)?"
