ORDINANCE 90-74

ESTABLYSHING A TWO-TERM LIMIT FOR ASSEMBLY AND SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS

WHEREAS, currently Assembly and School Board members can serve on the Assembly and School Board for an indefinite number of terms; and

WHEREAS, the intent of this ordinance is to limit Assembly and School Board members to two consecutive full terms of office at a time;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That KPB 22.30.030 is amended to read as follows:

- 22.30.030 Term of office--Commencement--Limitation. A. The full term of office for assembly members is 3 years.
- B. The regular term of office for an assembly member begins on the first Monday following the certification of that member's election by assembly resolution and of the member's swearing in.
- C. No assembly member may serve for more than two consecutive full terms; however, a person having served two consecutive full terms may again be elected or appointed after a lapse of one year. For the purposes of this section, a term of less than three years, to which a person is appointed or elected to serve, does not count as a full term.

Section 2. That KPB 1.20.100 is amended to read as follows:

1.20.100 School board-Number of seats--Term of office--Designation of seats. A. There is established a school board for the Kenai Peninsula Borough School District, composed of seven members, who shall be nominated and elected by the qualified voters of the borough as provided in the borough code of ordinances. Board members shall be elected at-large.

B. School board members are elected at the regular
borough election, for three-year terms, and serve until
their successors take office. No board member may serve
for more than two consecutive three-year terms; however,
a person having served two consecutive terms may again be
elected or appointed after a lapse of one year. For the
purposes of this section, a term of less than three
years, to which a person is appointed or elected to
serve, does not count as a full term.
