KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH ORDINANCE 92-48

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE TRANSITION OF THE ASSEMBLY FROM SIXTEEN TO NINE MEMBERS

- WHEREAS, borough voters approved the recomposition of the assembly from sixteen to nine members, and state statutes provide that the recomposition takes effect at the first regular barough election, which will be held October 6, 1992 and the results certified October 13, 1992; and
- WHEREAS, there may be as many as three assembly seats left empty after the assembly recomposition takes effect, if a runoff election is required; and
- WHEREAS, the runoff election results will not be certified until at least November 5, 1992, and meanwhile there will be no assembly representation for the seats that are empty; and
- WHEREAS, state statutes and borough ordinances currently give no guidance on how to fill the empty seats if a runoff election is required;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

- SECTION 1. That if a runoff election is held October 27, 1992 for assembly seats, the regular term of office for assembly members election at the runoff election begins immediately after certification of that member's election by assembly resolution and of the member's swearing in.
- SECTION 2. That this ordinance is effective immediately upon enactment, and shall be effective only for assembly members elected at the runoff election held October 27, 1992, if one is held.
