KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH ORDINANCE 93-06

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE NEGOTIATION OF A CONTRACT FOR EXTRACTION OF RIP RAP MATERIAL FROM THE BOROUGH'S SEWARD AREA QUARRY TO THE FEDERAL HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION CONTRACTOR ON THE EXIT GLACIER ROAD PROJECT WITH COMPENSATION TO BE PROVIDED IN THE FORM OF IN KIND SERVICES

- WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration has initiated a reconstruction project on the Exit Glacier Road, through the services of its general contractor, Southcoast, Inc.; and
- WHEREAS, the project includes construction of a rip rap revetment along the Resurrection River which will require additional material beyond that available on site; and
- WHEREAS, the Kenai Peninsula Borough has a continuing need for rip rap and other rock and gravel materials and desires to acquire a material stockpile for emergency conditions as they arise in the East Peninsula area; and
- WHEREAS, the Borough has developed a quarry on Borough lands located near the project, from which the FHWA contractor has requested 12,000 cubic yards of material; and
- WHEREAS, the current KPB Code provisions on sand, gravel and material sales do not provide for the sale of this quantity of material;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

- SECTION 1. That the Mayor is authorized to negotiate a contract with Southcoast, Inc., providing for access to the Borough's Seward area quarry for extraction of approximately 12,000 cubic yards of rip rap material in exchange for the additional extraction and sorting of material necessary to provide the Borough with a stockpile of rip rap, stone, and gravel materials in an amount of at least 12,000 cubic yards.
- SECTION 2. That the Mayor is authorized to execute all documents and enter all agreements

which he deems necessary to effectuate this ordinance.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment.
