KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH ORDINANCE 95-25

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$228,158.10 RECEIVED FROM THE ALYESKA QUALIFIED SETTLEMENT FUND

- WHEREAS, the court has approved distribution of municipality funds according to the Agreement Regarding Allocation of Settlement Proceeds from the Alyeska Qualified Settlement Fund Among Twenty-Four Participating Municipalities; and
- WHEREAS, the Alyeska Qualified Settlement Fund has submitted a check to the Borough in the amount of \$228,158.10; and
- WHEREAS, the villages of Nanwalek, Port Graham and Tyonek were three Kenai Peninsula Borough communities impacted by the Exxon Valdez oil spill in 1989; and
- WHEREAS, Chugachmiut, a non-profit corporation serving the Native people of the Chugach region, has requested \$70,000 to renovate existing facilities in Nanwalek and Port Graham in order to establish a Head Start program in those villages; and
- WHEREAS, the villages of Nanwalek, Port Graham and Tyonek in the past have requested assistance in improving their public utilities, including solid waste, water, and sewer;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

- **SECTION 1.** That the Mayor is authorized to execute all documents deemed necessary to effectuate this ordinance.
- **SECTION 2.** That the sum of \$228,158.10 is hereby appropriated from the General fund, fund balance, and transferred to the following accounts as follows:

272.321071.49999	Grants to Port Graham	\$102,671.15
272.321081.49999	Grants to Tyonek	\$ 22,815.80

SECTION 3. That \$35,000 from each of the accounts referenced in Section 2 shall be allocated to Chugachmiut for renovating existing facilities in Nanwalek and Port Graham for operating Head Start programs in those two communities.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance takes effect immediately upon its enactment.
