KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH ORDINANCE 2004-19-16

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING AND APPROPRIATING A STATE GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$10,000 FOR A FLASHING WARNING LIGHT FOR THE CENTRAL PENINSULA EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE AREA

- WHEREAS, the Central Peninsula Emergency Medical Service Area wishes to have a flashing warning beacon installed at the Funny River Emergency Services facility; and
- WHEREAS, Senate Bill 283, which appropriated funding to the Borough for this project, was passed by the State Legislature and signed by the Governor in July 2004; and
- WHEREAS, notice has been received from the Alaska Department of Community and Economic Development that a legislative grant has been awarded to the Borough in the amount of \$10,000 for a safety light in Funny River; and
- WHEREAS, at its regular meeting on October 21, 2004, the Central Emergency Service Area Board of Directors recommended enactment;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

- **SECTION 1.** That the mayor is authorized to accept a grant from the Department of Community and Economic Development in the amount of \$10,000 for the purchase and installation of a flashing warning beacon located at the Funny River Emergency Services facility, and is authorized to execute a grant agreement and any other documents deemed necessary to accept and expend the grant and to fulfill the intents and purposes of this ordinance.
- SECTION 2. That funds in the amount of \$10,000 are appropriated to account 220.52110.05060.43011.
- **SECTION 3.** That due to the length and nature of this project, the appropriations established through this ordinance shall not lapse at the end of any particular fiscal year.
- SECTION 4. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon enactment.
