Overview: Adding one additional staff member will allow the KPEDD the ability to track, monitor and report to the Assembly and the Administration on the following projects:

Workforce Development and Adult Vocational Education Center:

KPEDD has a lead role in facilitating the discussion between the State Department of Labor and Workforce Development and the Kenai Peninsula Borough Mayor.

In co-operation with researchers and economist within the Department of Labor and Workforce Development, KPEDD has completed a needs study producing an interactive spread sheet showing occupations and the job market for the next ten years, which are gas line jobs, and what level of education is required for each occupation.

It is our hope that this needs study will show enough support for a direct appropriation from the Department of Labor, or the Legislature for the funds necessary for a feasibility study.

Completion date of the feasibility study would be December 31st, 2009.

Pebble Mine

One of the largest mining operations in the State of Alaska's History would be the Pebble Mine, located across Cook Inlet, partially within the Kenai Borough.

This Mine is very controversial as it will test the State, Federal and Local Governments permitting processes, and their ability to protect other resources, such as the fisheries, while considering the permitting of the mine to start up operations.

If the mine proceeds, the impacts and the opportunities to the Kenai Borough will be great. KPEDD will tract, monitor and report on the status of this operation.

<u>Alaska Natural Gas Development Authority, Alaska Gas lines Proposals, Port</u> <u>Authority Proposal and Enstar Bullet line Proposal:</u>

Of great interest to our Borough residents and to our industrial base, is access to Natural Gas for the Cook Inlet Basin.

The hopes for in-state gas are engrossed within the Trans Canada and Denali Gas lines, and the ANGDA's mandate to supply the entire State with Natural gas.

Meetings are held all over the State, as well as Washington DC.

KPEDD would track monitor and report on the progress of all of these proposals.

Cook Inlet Oil and Gas Production

Work with, as needed, Conoco-Phillips, Marathon, and other oil and gas producers on the Kenai Peninsula.

Work with Rep Seaton, Senator Gary Stevens and Armstrong Oil and Gas for the delivery of gas to the Anchor Point and Homer areas.

Track, monitor and report on the progress of the jack-up rig for Cook Inlet.

West Side of the Inlet Development:

KPEDD is currently monitoring the proposed projects that might occur on the West Side of Cook Inlet. Mentioned projects are the Coal power plants, coal to gas liquidation plant, Geo-thermal energy at Mount Spur, proposed railroad spur to point Mackenzie, Export coal loading facility, and the on going logging operations.

Tyonek Native Village has partnered with industry and business companies on many of these projects.

KPEDD has agreed to partner with Tyonek Corporation to submit grants for some of the transportation needs.

Creation of the Kenai Municipal Conference:

KPEDD will prepare and file the Articles of Incorporation and the Bylaws of the Corporation. At least two public meetings, and attendance and presentations at the Assembly and City Councils should be expected prior to each Government accepting membership.

The first organization meeting has been held, and a subcommittee for the drafting of the by-laws has met and the proposed by-laws are being drafted.

Oyster Growers, Homer

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Continue working with the Oyster growers on the opening of their new retail and wholesale plant on the Homer Spit. The group continues to have funding issues for the start up of the facility.
