RESOLUTION 67-46

A RESOLUTION CERTIFYING RESULTS OF THE REGULAR ELECTION OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH HELD OCTOBER 3, 1967

WHEREAS, the assembly has received from the election board of the Soldotna election precincts, pursuant to the provisions of the election procedures Resolution No. 31 as amended; a certificate of the results of the borough general election held on October 3, 1967; and

PROPOSITION NO. 1. Shall the Kenai Peninsula Borough incur indebtedness in a sum not exceeding \$10,000,000 for the purpose of acquiring sites and constructing new school buildings and obtaining therefore necessary facilities, including but not limited to senior high schools, junior high school, elementary schools, and additions to existing facilities, as the assembly of the Kenai Peninsula Borough may from time to time determine to be necessary and pledge the full faith and credit of the Kenai Peninsula Borough to the payment of any indebtedness so incurred and issue general obligation bonds with interest at a rate not to exceed six percent per annum, and to mature in such amounts and at such time or times, not exceeding 30 years from date of issue, and to be issued in such series or amounts and at such time, all as may be found necessary by the assembly of the Kenai Peninsula Borough?

PROPOSITION NO. 2. Shall the Kenai Peninsula Borough incur indebtedness in a sum not to exceed \$300,000 for the purpose of constructing a borough administration building for school and general administration purposes, on a site approved by the assembly of the Kenai Peninsula Borough, and pledge the full faith and credit of the Kenai Peninsula Borough to the payment of any indebtedness so incurred and issue general obligation bonds with interest at a rate not to exceed six percent per annum, and to mature in such amounts and at such times, not exceeding 30 years from date of issue, and to be issued in such series or amounts and at such time or times, all as may be found necessary by the assembly of the Kenai Peninsula Borough?

NOW, THEREFORE, THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

1. Declares that Fritz Hall, Thomas Woodford and Mrs. Earl Fisler received the highest number of votes, these being 481, 478, and 439, respectively, and therefore have been elected to the three year assembly terms; that Mrs. Catherine M. Malone received 283 votes and therefore has been elected

to the two year term assembly seat; that Charles Rainwater received 348 votes and has been elected to the one year assembly seat; that John Galea received 790 votes and has been elected to the three year school board term; that Ruth Kilcher received 1037 votes and has been elected to the one year school board term.

2. Takes note that Proposition No. 1 received 551 Yes votes and 863 No votes; and the proposition failed.

3. Takes note that Proposition No. 2 received 419 Yes votes and 981 No votes; and the proposition failed.

4. Takes note that Proposition No. 3 received 956 Yes votes and 1100 No votes; and the proposition failed

5. Takes note that a tabulation of the write-in votes is attached and made a part of this resolution.

6. Takes note that the total vote on the regular election was 2,167 and on the bonding proposition was 1,438.
