RESOLUTION 74-41

A RESOLUTION CERTIFYING THE RESULTS OF THE SPECIAL ELECTIONS HELD JULY 30, 1974.

WHEREAS, the assembly of the Kenai Peninsula Borough has received from the Borough Canvassing Board the "Certificate of Results of the special elections held on July 30, 1974, in the South Peninsula Hospital area and in the North Kenai area; and

WHEREAS, the "Certificate of Results" records the following:

South Peninsula Hospital Service Area

"PROPOSITION: Do You Approve Ordinance 74-30 Which Would Repeal Chapter 20 of Title 27 of the Kenai Peninsula Borough Code of Ordinances Which Would:

1. Dissolve the South Kenai Peninsula Hospital Service Area;
2. Make the dissolution effective as to operation of any hospital in that area by the Kenai Peninsula Borough as of the date the votes are canvassed if the vote approves the ordinance;
3. Make the dissolution effective as to power of the Assembly to levy and collect taxes in the area when all legal debts of the service area are paid which were incurred before dissolution;
4. Result in the breaking of the lease the Borough now has from the City of Homer to the present hospital and cause that hospital to be returned to the City of Homer for control, financial support, operation, or closing as the City of Homer may decide?"
