RESOLUTION NO. 75-18

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING AND ENCOURAGING IMPLEMENTATION OF A CLOSED SEASON ON ALL MOOSE IN THE SOUTHWESTERN PORTION OF THE KENAI PENINSULA.

WHEREAS, that portion of the Kenai Peninsula lying southwest and west of Tutka Bay, a line joining the head of Tutka Bay with the head of Taylor Bay, and Taylor Bay has not in the past sustained any appreciable moose population; and

WHEREAS, due to timber cutting, portions of this area are becoming viable as a moose habitat and attractive to a moose population; and

WHEREAS, any moose wandering into this area are promptly killed because there is an open season on moose within the area; and

WHEREAS, closing this area to all moose hunting for a number of years would allow moose coming into the area to build up a moose population that would add to the resources of the area and be an attribute to the area;

NOW THEREFORE. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

That the Assembly of the Kenai Peninsula Borough hereby encourages and supports closing to all moose hunting that area of the Kenai Peninsula Borough lying southwest and west of Tutka Bay, a line joining the head of Tutka Bay with the head of Taylor Bay, and Taylor Bay until such time as the moose population therein is built up into a renewable resource.
