PROPOSITION 2:

Shall Ordinance 79-44 (Substitute) be approved to authorize the Kenai Peninsula Borough to incur indebtedness and issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$22,000,000 which, together with \$2,500,000 in unexpended funds authorized by Ord. 77-51, shall be utilized for the purpose of constructing, improving and equipping:
North Kenai Junior High School in an amount not to exceed \$7,000,000;
Nikolaevsk School Addition in the amount of \$1,648,000;
Ninilchik School Addition - Scheme B, in the amount of \$1,970,000;
New Elementary School at Homer, in the amount of \$3,393,000;
Four Classroom Addition at North Kenai in the amount of \$939,000;
Homer High School Phase II - Theater in the amount of \$2,466,000;
and Food Service Facility, in the amount of \$2,348,000;
Homer Middle School, in the amount of \$1,290,000;
Kenai Central High School Auditorium, in the amount of \$3,102,000;
and Soldotna Junior High Addition, in the amount of \$693,000;
with payment of such indebtedness to be made from taxes levied within the Kenai Peninsula Borough, and from such other revenues as may be properly pledged for such payment; with the full faith and credit of the Kenai Peninsula Borough pledged for the repayment of the indebtedness?

Shall Ordinance 79-47 be approved to authorize the Kenai Peninsula Borough to incur indebtedness and issue bonds in an amount not to exceed \$6,762,646, to be used for capital improvements at the Central Peninsula General Hospital with payment of such indebtedness to be made from taxes levied within the Central Peninsula Hospital Service Area as may be properly pledged for such payment; with the full faith and credit of the Central Peninsula Hospital Service Area pledged for the repayment of the indebtedness?

NOW THEREFORE, THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH DECLARES:

1. That Tommy Corr and John C. Davis received 907 and 984 respectively and are elected to three year terms on the borough assembly having each received in excess of 40% (832) of the votes cast for those seats. As a third candidate did not receive 40%, a runoff election will be held on October 23, 1979 with the two highest, K. Lewis Fields (682) and Merrill S. Sikorski (658) candidates for the third seat.

2. That Joyce W. Fischer and Mary R. Hawkins received 2,030 and 1,839 respectively and are elected to three year terms on the borough school board having each received in excess of 40% of the votes cast for those two seats. No candidate for the one year term received 40% (1,540), therefore the two highest candidates, Joseph C. Arness (1315) and Mary Ann Lee (755) will be involved in the runoff to be held October 23, 1979.

3. That Martin J. Patterson received 68 votes and is elected to a one year term on the Bear Creek Fire Service Area Board, Seat B, and Marie Herin received 59 votes and is elected to a three year term, Seat C. There were no declared candidates for Seat D, a three year term, and the vacancy will be filled by the board of directors.

4. That there were no candidates for Seat A, a one year term on the Nikiski Fire Service Area Board. Because there was a declared write-in candidate who did not get 40% of the vote, there will be a runoff election between the two persons, Preston Williams and Karen McGahan, who received the greatest number of votes for the seat. Warren F. Enzler received 425 votes and is elected to a three year term, Seat D and Charles P. Koehler received 456 votes and is elected to a three year term, Seat E.

5. That Carol K. Unruh received 320 votes and is elected to a one year term, Seat B, James J. Goff received 280 votes and is elected to a three year term, Seat C, and Charles P. Koehler received 364 votes and is elected to a three year term, Seat D.

6. That Gene R. Williams received 619 votes and is elected to a three year term, Seat A, Marguerite Jacobs received 629 votes and is elected to a three year term, and John Cooper received 675 votes and is elected to a three year term, Seat C.

7. That Proposition 1 received 821 affirmative votes within the cities and 893 negative votes and hereby failed to be approved by the voters residing within the cities of the Kenai Peninsula Borough. In the area outside the cities, Proposition 1 received 1,271 affirmative votes and 919 negative votes, but failed to be approved both inside and outside the cities.


8. That Proposition 2 received 1,842 affirmative votes and 2,686 negative votes and hereby failed to be approved by the voters of the Kenai Peninsula Borough.

9. That Proposition 3 received 1,593 affirmative votes and 1,110 negative votes and was hereby approved by the voters of the Central Peninsula Hospital Service Area.

10. That Proposition 4 received 254 affirmative votes and 390 negative votes and hereby failed approval of the voters of the North Peninsula Recreation Service Area.

11. That Proposition 5 received 292 affirmative votes and 340 negative votes and hereby failed approval of the voters of the North Peninsula Recreation Service Area.
