RESOLUTION 81-16

PROVIDING FOR THE DISPOSAL OF SEPTAGE WASTES AT BOROUGH LANDFILLS AND REQUESTING THE IMMEDIATE PREPARATION OF A COST STUDY AND COMPREHENSIVE PLAN FOR SUCH DISPOSALS.

WHEREAS, the Borough currently exercises solid waste collection and disposal powers within the entire area of the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the disposal of septic tank sediments, known as septage waste, has become an increasingly serious problem requiring immediate attention by the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Assembly finds that the State of Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation and the United States Environmental Protection Agency have included septage wastes in their definitions of solid wastes; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly desires that the Borough provide for the treatment and disposal of septage wastes generated in the areas outside cities as soon as possible and in the most efficient manner; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly finds that the lack of facilities for the disposal of septage wastes is now a serious threat to the public health; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly has been presented with a petition by affected citizens requesting immediate Borough action to resolve the problem;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH.

Section 1. That the Assembly finds that septic tank pumpings, known as septage wastes, are solid wastes and that the disposal of these wastes is within the Borough's existing authority to provide for the collection and disposal of solid wastes.

Section 2. That the Assembly requests the Mayor to prepare and present to the Assembly within 90 days a cost

Kenai Peninsula Borough Resolution 81-16 Page 1 of 2 Pages study and comprehensive plan for the collection, treatment and disposal of septage wastes in the areas outside cities. The study shall consider: 1) possible methods of collection, treatment and disposal; 2) proposed sites for treatment facilities; 3) a detailed cost analysis of each element of a septage waste disposal program; 4) the possibility of contracting with various cities within the Borough for the treatment and disposal of a portion of such wastes; 5) the possibility of obtaining State and federal grants to offset a portion of the costs of constructing and maintaining such facilities; and 6) an estimated operational budget for such facilities for the next three fiscal years.

 $\frac{\text{Section 3}}{\text{resolution}}$. That the Mayor is authorized to effectuate this resolution, which takes effect immediately upon its adoption.
