That for the office of Borough Mayor Vincent O'Reilly and Stanley F. Thompson received 2,455 and 3,232 votes respectively, neither receiving the necessary 50 percent of the total votes cast for Mayor and will therefore be candidates in a Runoff Election to be held October 27, 1981.

- 2. That for Borough School Board candidate Carolyn Cannava received 4,480, Jerry Hobart received 3,390 and Debra Mullins received 2,811 and are elected to three year terms.
- 3. That there were no vacancies in District I. In District II, Tommy Corr received 742 votes and John (Jack) Lounsbury received 676 votes but neither the required 40 percent of the votes cast for Seat A and will be candidates in the Runoff Election.
- 4. That in District III John H. Douglas received 877 votes, over the required 40 percent and is elected to a three year term in Seat B. That Joe Arness received 1,172 votes and is elected to a three year term in Seat C.
- 5. That in District IV John Crawford received 885 votes and is elected to a three year term in Seat A.
- 6. That within the Bear Creek Fire Service Area Kerry T. Martin received 94 votes and is elected to a three year term in Seat C.
- 7. That within the Nikiski Fire Service Area Joanne Brandon received 699 votes and is elected to a one year term in Seat E; Larry L. Hawkins received 438 votes and is elected to a three year term in Seat F and Harry Thirlwell received 404 votes and is elected to a three year term in Seat G.
- 8. That within the North Peninsula Recreation Service Area Richard McGahan received 390 votes and is elected to a three year term in Seat E.
- 9. That within the Kenai River Bridge Subdivision Service Area Marcia Overway received 13 votes and is elected to a three year term in Seat E.
- 10. That within the Ridgeway Fire Service Area there was no candidate for Seat B, a two year term or Seat C, a one year term and those vacancies will be appointed by the board to serve until the next regular election. Gary Effenbeck, who received 313 votes for Seat E is elected to a three year term.
- 11. That within the South Kenai Peninsula Hospital Service Area Howard Myhill received 1,193 votes and is elected to three year term in Seat D, Leroy Gannaway received 1,095 votes and is elected to a three year term in Seat E and Viola M. Hansen received 1,112 and is elected to a three year term in Seat F.
- 12. That Proposition E for establishment of four road service areas for the purpose of providing road maintenance services to the four assembly districts excepting the cities was approved in each

service area. In the East Kenai Peninsula Road Maintenance Service Area there were no candidates for the five member board and therefore the board will be appointed by the Mayor until the next election. That in the North Kenai Peninsula Road Maintenance Service Area Richard McGahan received 633 votes and is elected to Seat A, a three year term, Jess Lobdell received 429 votes and is elected to Seat B, a three year term, Emeline (Red) Newman received 606 votes and is elected to Seat C, a 2 year term, Marti McGahan received 580 votes and is elected to Seat D, a two year term and Joanne Brandon received 446 votes and is elected to Seat E, a one year term. That in the Central Kenai Peninsula Road Maintenance Service Area Don Miessner received 663 votes and is elected to Seat A, a three year term, Francis Moore received 934 votes and is elected to Seat B, a three year term, Peter Cannava received 797 votes and is elected to Seat C, a two year term, Gary Effenbeck received 594 votes and is elected to Seat D, a two year term and Vern Fisher received 523 votes and is elected to Seat E, a one year term. the South Kenai Peninsula Road Maintenance Service Area Rita Jo Schoultz received 381 votes and is elected to Seat C, a two year term and Cecil H. Lewis received 336 votes and is elected to Seat E, a one year term. There were no candidates for Seats A and B, three year terms and Seat D, a two year term and the Mayor will appoint board members to fill those seats until the next borough election.

- 13. That Proposition F for formation of the Central Peninsula Emergency Medical Service and Ambulance Service Area was approved by a vote of 1,869 Yes votes to 485 No votes and is thereby approved by the voters of the precincts contained in Assembly District II. A five member board was elected consisting of Thomas M. Newby, Seat A, a three year term, Mildred I. Fitzgerald, Seat B, a three year term, James E. Matti, Seat C, a two year term, Billie Jean Phillips, Seat D, a two year term and Greg B. Barclay to Seat E, a one year term.
- 14. That Proposition A for approval of a bond issue not to exceed \$25,802,000 for construction of the following schools was approved: Anchor Point School Addition, Cooper Landing School Addition, North Kenai School Addition and a new elementary school at McNeil Canyon. Not approved by the voters was KCHS Auditorium (1200 seats).
- 15. That Proposition B to signify approval to begin design, preparation of plans and cost estimates for Seldovia School Addition was approved. Not approved were a new high school at Homer, a new elementary at Kalifonsky, and a new junior high school at Nikiski.
- 16. That Proposition C to retain the current form of Borough Assembly representation was approved by a vote of 4,898 Yes to 1,266 No.
