KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH

RESOLUTION 81-208

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO SEND A DELEGATION TO WASHINGTON, D.C. FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING CERTAIN PARCELS OF THE KENAI NATIONAL MOOSE RANGE LAND THROUGH A LAND EXCHANGE.

WHEREAS, the Borough authorizes the operation of the Sterling Special Waste Site through its lease agreement with Mar Enterprises; and

WHEREAS, the residents around the Sterling Special Waste Site have requested the Borough to relocate said site to the Kenai National Moose Range; and

WHEREAS, at present the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services has offered a piece of land on the boundary of the Kenai National Moose Range; and

WHEREAS, residents near the offered lands have objected to its proposed use as a special waste site; and

WHEREAS, other lands between Skilak Lake Road and the Sterling Highway would appear to be available for relocation of the special waste site;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the Mayor is authorized to undertake negotiations with federal authorities in charge of the Kenai National Moose Range to exchange Borough lands for lands located in Section 14, 15, 16, 21, 22, and 27 all of T5N, R7W, Seward Meridian, Alaska.

Section 2. That the Mayor is authorized to effectuate this resolution, which takes effect immediately upon its adoption.

Section 3. That the Assembly shall consider the appointment of a special committee to accompany Borough representatives designated by the Mayor to meet with Alaska's congressional delegation and appropriate authorities of the Bureau of Land Management or other federal authorities charged with the supervision and management of the Kenai National Moose Range.

Section 4. That this resolution takes effect immediately upon its adoption.
