RESOLUTION 81-209

AMENDING THE PROCUREMENT AND PURCHASING POLICY ADOPTED IN RESOLUTION 77-5.

WHEREAS, the Assembly adopted a procurement and purchasing policy in Resolution 77-5, adopted February 15, 1977; and

WHEREAS, almost four years of inflation have transpired causing an upward spiral of prices; and

WHEREAS, the planning of projects into phases can inure to the benefit of taxpayers by taking advantage of cost factors;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the fourth paragraph of Section 1 of the procurement and purchasing policy adopted by Resolution 77-5 is amended to read:

"Formal competitive bidding procedures will be used for all expenditures for services, supplies, and contracts in excess of \$10,000. Splitting the amount of the expenditures for the purpose of evading the formal bid procedure is a direct violation of this policy; provided, however, that the division of a project into engineering, planning and fiscally sound phases to take advantage of price factors, construction schedules, construction seasons, labor supply, product availability, etc., is not a violation of this policy."

Section 2. That this resolution takes effect immediately upon its adoption.
