RESOLUTION 82-4

AUTHORIZING REPRESENTATIVES OF WILDER CONSTRUCTION TO MAKE A FORMAL PRESENTATION TO THE ASSEMBLY ON SOLID WASTE INCINERATION AND TRANSFERRING FUNDS.

WHEREAS, the Borough exercises Borough-wide solid waste powers; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly recognizes the need to conserve and efficiently utilize the lands used and available to landfills; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly also recognizes the desirability of energy recovery for solid wastes; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly desires additional information regarding the overall feasibility of incineration in the solid waste disposal program; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly finds that a presentation of information by persons or companies with information and experience in the field will assist the Assembly's deliberations in seeking solutions to the solid waste problem;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the Assembly authorizes representatives of Wilder Construction to make a formal presentation to the Assembly regarding solid waste incineration with heat recovery based on the company's information and experience in the field of solid waste incineration.

Section 2. That \$2,000 is transferred from Assembly Contingency Account No. 01-41110-7400 to Account No. 01-41110-3020 (Consultant Travel) to cover the expenditure provided, however, that Wilder Construction will reimburse the Borough for the \$2,000 expenditure in the event that a contract is entered into with Wilder Construction for a solid waste facility within three years of the adoption of this resolution.

Section 3. That this resolution takes effect immediately upon its adoption.
