RESOLUTION 82-111

SUPPORTING THE STATE CAPITAL MOVE FROM JUNEAU, ALASKA.

WHEREAS, the people of Alaska have voted in favor of moving the State Capital from Juneau, Alaska;

WHEREAS, Juneau remains inaccessible to the populace thereby making participation in the affairs of government and attendance at legislative functions impracticable for most persons;

WHEREAS, the will of the people should be respected over and above the voice of politicians and selfish interests;

WHEREAS, the State Capital relocation committee is presently working on an orderly transition with the least financial impact upon Juneau, Alaska;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the Assembly wholeheartedly supports moving the State Capital from Juneau, Alaska in order to make democratic government more accessible to the people of Alaska; and in order to carry out the will of the people who voted to move the capital away from Juneau, Alaska.

Section 2. That this resolution takes effect upon its adoption and shall be served upon Governor Jay S. Hammond; Senate President Jalmar M. Kertulla; House Speaker Joe Hayes; Senator Donald E. Gilman; Representatives Hugh Malone, Patrick M. O'Connell, and Bette M. Cato; and Margaret Branson, Chairwoman for "New Capital Site Planning Commission."
