## RESOLUTION 82-174

A RESOLUTION CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION ON OCTOBER 26, 1982 FOR APPROVAL OR DISAPPROVAL OF THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE ANCHOR POINT FIRE AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE AREA BY THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THAT AREA AND PROVIDING FOR ELECTION OF A FIVE MEMBER BOARD.

WHEREAS, a petition signed by more than 15% of those voting in the last election and requesting that a fire and emergency medical service area be formed in the Anchor Point Area has been received by the Borough Clerk;

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held in the Anchor Point area on August 11, 1982;

WHEREAS, it appears to be the desire of the public in the Anchor Point Election Precinct to place a proposition before the people at a special election on October 26, 1982;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

- 1. A special election is hereby called to be held October 26, 1982, for the purpose of approving or disapproving of the following proposition and for electing from the qualified voters of the proposed Anchor Point Fire and Emergency Medical Service Area a five member board.
  - (a) The proposition to be placed on the ballot shall read:

PROPOSITION: Do you approve establishment of the Anchor Point Fire and Emergency Medical Service Area described as:

(To be added after the public hearing on September 2.)

for the purpose of providing fire protection to the residents of the Anchor Point Fire and Emergency Medical Service Area?

At the same election there shall be elected a five member Board of Directors to serve in the event the service area is approved, and for the purpose of such election, candidates shall file for specific seats designated A, B, C, D, and E, and the terms for each of such seats shall be as follows:

- A. Three Years
- B. Three Years
- C. Two years for the initial term and three years for subsequent terms
- D. Two years for the initial term and three years for subsequent terms
- E. One year for the initial term and three years for subsequent terms.
- 2. A candidate for any office specified in this notice must be a qualified voter of the Anchor Point Fire and Emergency Medical Service Area. Nomination by petition signed by ten qualified voters of the Anchor Point Fire and Emergency Medical Service Area is required to qualify a person as a candidate whose name is to be listed on the ballot. Nomination petitions will be available September 23, 1982 and may be filed with the borough clerk at the Borough Office, Soldotna, Alaska, until 4:00 p.m., October 4, 1982. Petitions must be received in the borough office prior to the time and date specified in order to be valid. A person named in the nomination petition must sign thereon the following statement: "I hereby accept the above nomination and agree to serve if elected." This statement is a part of the nomination petition. Nomination petition forms may be obtained from the borough clerk's office by request in person or by mail.
- 3. Any person is qualified to vote who: Is a citizen of the United States; is qualified to vote in state elections; has been a resident of that portion of the Kenai Peninsula Borough included within the Anchor Point Fire and Emergency Medical Service Area for at least 30 days immediately preceding the election; and, is registered with the State of Alaska as a voter in the Anchor Point Election Precinct.
- 4. The polling place is established in the Anchor Point Community Hall.
- 5. Polls will be open from 8:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m.
