AUTHORIZING THE REPLACEMENT OF EXISTING OVERHEAD POWER LINES PARALLELING FIREWEED AVENUE AND THE LINE IMMEDIATELY NORTH OF THE CENTRAL PENINSULA HOSPITAL WITH EQUIVALENT UNDERGROUND FACILITIES.

WHEREAS, the Borough on behalf of the Central Peninsula General Hospital Service Area, solicited a proposal for replacement of the existing overhead power lines adjacent to the hospital; and

WHEREAS, the existing overhead power lines create a hazard and liability for helicopters approaching the hospital; and

WHEREAS, the removal of the existing overhead power lines is necessary to construct a helipad acceptable to the Federal Aviation Association (FAA); and

WHEREAS, the Service Area Board, at its regular meeting of February 11, 1982 examined proposals from the Homer Electric Association, and recommends acceptance.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the proposals, Quote 1 and Quote 2 dated October 27, 1981, from the Homer Electric Association, Inc. for replacement of existing overhead power lines paralleling Fireweed and North of the Central Peninsula Hospital with equivalent underground facilities from pole G6/29/1G9 to pole XG6/29/3G9 and, from pole AG6/29/1G9 to Pole G6/29/2K for the amount of \$38,943 is accepted and a contract is authorized. All expenditures for this project shall be charged to the Central Peninsula Hospital Account #53-45210-9620.

Section 2. That the sum of \$38,943 is transferred from the Hospital Contingency Account #53-45210-9007 to Account #53-45210-9620.
