RESOLUTION 83-142

SUPPORTING THE APPLICATION FOR A RURAL DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE GRANT BY THE MOOSE PASS VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT FOR THE PURCHASE OF NEEDED FIRE EQUIPMENT.

WHEREAS, the Moose Pass Volunteer Fire Department is requesting a Rural Development Assistance Grant from the State of Alaska, Department of Community and Regional Affairs for the purpose of purchasing a pumper-tanker; and

WHEREAS, such equipment will upgrade the Community's fire fighting services by replacing antiquated equipment which has far outlived its usefulness; and

WHEREAS, the Moose Pass Volunteer Fire Department has been providing valuable fire protection services to the Greater Moose Pass area for a period of 30 years; and

WHEREAS, the Kenai Peninsula Borough has not assumed any fire service responsibilities for the Moose Pass area; and

WHEREAS, the Moose Pass Volunteer Fire Department has requested support from the Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly for their funding application.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:


Section 1. That the Assembly endorses the request of the Moose Pass Volunteer Fire Department for a Rural Development Assistance Grant to be paid directly to the Moose Pass Volunteer Fire Department for the purposes of funding needed fire fighting equipment.

Section 2. That the Clerk shall serve copies of this Resolution upon the State of Alaska, Department of Community and Regional Affairs; upon the Honorable Paul Fischer and Don Gilman, State Senators; upon the Honorable Bette Cato, Milo Fritz, and Hugh Malone, State Representatives; and upon the President of the Moose Pass Volunteer Fire Department.

Section 3. That this Resolution takes effect immediately upon its adoption.
