RESOLUTION 83-179

CALLING FOR AN ELECTION FOR APPROVAL OR DISAPPROVAL OF THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE ANCHOR POINT FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICE AREA, AND PROVIDING FOR THE ELECTION OF A FIVE-MEMBER BOARD.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That an election is called on October 4, 1983, for the purpose of approving or disapproving the ballot proposition and for electing from the qualified voters of the Anchor Point Fire and Emergency Service Area a five-member board. The proposition to be placed on the ballot shall read:

Do you approve establishment of the Anchor Point Fire and Emergency Service Area described as:

All lands easterly of the easterly mean high waterline of Cook Inlet within:

Sections 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 33, 34, 35, 36, T4S, R15W, S.M.

Sections 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, T4S, R14W, S.M.

Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, T5S, R15W, S.M.

Sections 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 16, 17, 18, T5S, R14W, S.M.

for the purpose of providing fire protection and emergency medical services to the residents of the Anchor Point Fire and Emergency Service Area.

Section 2. That at the same election there shall be elected a five-member Board of Directors to serve in the event the service area is approved, and for the purpose of such election, candidates shall file for specific seats designated A, B, C, D, and E, and the terms for each of such seats shall be as follows:

A - Three years

B - Three years

- C - Two years for the initial term, and three years for subsequent terms
- D - Two years for the initial term, and three years for subsequent terms
- E - One year for the initial term, and three years for subsequent terms

Section 3. That a candidate for any office specified in this notice must be a qualified voter of the Anchor Point Fire and Emergency Service Area. Nomination by petition signed by ten qualified voters of the Anchor Point Fire and Emergency Service Area is required to qualify a person as a candidate whose name is to be listed on the ballot. Nomination petitions may be filed with the Borough Clerk at the Borough office, Soldotna, Alaska, until 4:00 p.m. September 2, 1983. Petitions must be received in the Borough office prior to the time and date specified in order to be valid. A person named in the nomination petition must sign thereon the following statement: "I hereby accept the above nomination and agree to serve if elected." This statement is a part of the nomination petition. Nomination petition forms may be obtained from the Borough Clerk's office by request in person or by mail.


Section 4. That any person is qualified to vote who: Is a citizen of the United States who is qualified to vote in state elections, has been a resident of that portion of the Kenai Peninsula Borough included within the Anchor Point Fire and Emergency Service Area for at least 30 days immediately preceding the election, and is registered with the State of Alaska as a voter in the precinct in which he resides.

Section 5. That the polling place is established at the Anchor Point Community Hall or at such other place as may be designated by the election official.

Section 6. That polls will be open from 8:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m.

Section 7. That a qualified voter may vote by absentee ballot in accordance with state law.
