KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH

RESOLUTION 83-203

REQUESTING THE MAYOR TO POSTPONE THE NOVEMBER 7 TIMBER SALES FOR SIXTY DAYS AND PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A SPECIAL COMMITTEE TO REVIEW TIMBER SALE PROCEDURES AND PRACTICE.

WHEREAS, Kenai Peninsula Borough Ordinance 17.08.010 grants "the Mayor authority to negotiate for the salvage or harvest of dead or mature timber of commercial value"; and

WHEREAS, said ordinance provides that the Mayor may request proposals from interested parties, including the amount they would pay; and

WHEREAS, said ordinance directs the Mayor to negotiate contracts for said sales; and


WHEREAS, the Borough has published notice that it will sell eight 40 acre blocks and four government lots of timber together with other tracts located near Seward, Alaska on Monday, November 7, 1983, on a first come first serve basis rather than as prescribed in said ordinance;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the Mayor of the Kenai Peninsula Borough is requested to postpone the November 7, 1983, timber sales for sixty days.


Section 2. That the Assembly President shall appoint a special committee to review timber sale ordinances, procedures, and practices and provide a report to the Assembly not later than December 6, 1983.


