KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH

RESOLUTION 83-224

ESTABLISHING A COMMITTEE TO STUDY AND EVALUATE THE PROSPECTS OF BOROUGH OWNED HOSPITALS TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR EITHER SALE OR RETENTION.

WHEREAS, the Kenai Peninsula Borough, through its service areas, owns and operates the Central Peninsula Hospital and the South Peninsula Hospital; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly desires to explore the alternatives of either continuing to provide these services or ascertaining if hospital care can be provided through the private sector; and

WHEREAS, in order to make an informed decision it is necessary to have full and complete information regarding the current status and prospects of the hospitals. Such information can only be provided through a full study and evaluation of current operations and status;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That there is hereby created a committee to study and make recommendations regarding the retention or possible sale of Borough owned hospitals. In formulating recommendations, the committee will fully study and evaluate the current operations of the hospitals and obtain such assistance as necessary from the Borough staff, hospital administrators and hospital boards to evaluate the future prospects of these hospitals under either private ownership or continued Borough ownership.

Section 2. That the committee shall consist of not less than five (5) nor more than nine (9) members who shall be appointed by the Mayor.

Section 3. That the committee shall perform its functions and make its recommendations to the Mayor and the Assembly no later than August 31, 1984.

Section 4. That this resolution takes effect immediately upon its adoption.
