RESOLUTION 83-89

SUPPORTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A MAXIMUM SECURITY PRISON AT SEWARD, ALASKA.

WHEREAS, a prison facility would provide employment and stimulate the economy of the Seward area; and

WHEREAS, Seward, Alaska is an ideal location for a maximum security prison facility; and

WHEREAS, a prison facility in the Seward area would result in an increased real and personal property tax base and increased sales taxes for the benefit of the entire Borough;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the Assembly of the Kenai Peninsula Borough supports the concept of the establishment of a maximum security prison at Seward, Alaska.



Section 2. That the Honorable Governor William J. Sheffield is requested to identify Seward, Alaska as an area for comprehensive study as to the feasibility of establishing the maximum security prison in that area.

Section 3. That the Thirteenth Legislature is requested to appropriate sufficient monies to fund a realistic and comprehensive feasibility study of this concept to ensure that the final decision as to the location of the facility is sound.
