RESOLUTION 84-10

URGING SOLUTIONS TO THE GAS PRICING PROBLEM OTHER THAN PROSECUTION OF AN ANTI-TRUST ACTION AGAINST LOCAL OIL COMPANIES.

WHEREAS, there may be other alternatives to solving the problem of gas wholesale pricing on the Kenai Peninsula; and

WHEREAS, it may be unnecessary to expose the Kenai Peninsula Borough to the potential liability which is inherent in this type of litigation;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the Borough mayor is urged to withdraw the Borough from the class action anti-trust lawsuit recently filed against the oil companies marketing products in the local area.

Section 2. That the Borough mayor is requested to call a meeting with responsible, knowledgeable individuals representing these various companies in a final attempt to get logical, rational explanations of price differences.

Section 3. That failing that, the Borough mayor is urged to submit what information he has available to the State of Alaska, Attorney General Office for possible prosecution of an anti-trust action.

Section 4. That should the State prove unresponsive, the mayor is urged to bring the question back to the Assembly for a joint decision as to whether or not to once again pursue the original action.
