RESOLUTION 84-31

IN SUPPORT OF CONSTRUCTION OF A COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH CENTER IN HOMER, ALASKA (HB 482).

WHEREAS, there is need for construction of a facility to house the Community Mental Health Center, located in Homer, which provides comprehensive outpatient community mental health services to the residents of Homer, Ninilchik, Anchor Point, Nikolaevsk, Kachemak City, Seldovia, Halibut Cove, Port Graham and English Bay; and

WHEREAS, this same facility would house a vocational counseling program, an infant learning program, a family services program, a child abuse/child neglect prevention program, as well as psychiatric services through the Community Mental Health Center, and the Cook Inlet Council on Alcohol and Drug Abuse; and

WHEREAS, the City of Homer has shown its support by allocating \$35,000 during November 1982 to initiate land acquisition and building planning, and Representative Milo Fritz has pre-filed House Bill 482 which would grant to the City of Homer \$306,500 for construction of a building to house the mental health services;


NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the Assembly supports the construction of a mental health facility in Homer, and specifically endorses the passage of HB 482.

Section 2. That copies of this resolution be distributed to Governor Bill Sheffield, State Senators Don Gilman and Paul Fischer, and House Representatives Hugh Malone, Milo Fritz, and Bette Cato, and Mae Tischer.

Section 3. That this resolution takes effect immediately upon its adoption.
