RESOLUTION 84-64

GRANTING A GRAVEL EXTRACTION PERMIT TO PHILLIPS PETROLEUM COMPANY ON TRACT DD-1, MOOSE POINT SUBDIVISION,

WHEREAS, Phillips Petroleum Company has applied for approval to extract gravel from a portion of Tract DD-1, Moose Point Subdivision for use in repair work on its gas pipeline in the area; and

WHEREAS, the applicant has submitted a formal Gravel Extraction Plan for extraction and reclamation;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the Mayor is authorized to issue a permit to Phillips Petroleum Company for the extraction of approximately 20,000 cubic yards of gravel from Borough owned land described as Tract DD-1, Moose Point Subdivision subject to the following conditions and terms:

a. Extraction shall be made and reclamation conducted per Gravel Extraction Plan submitted to the Borough on March 6, 1984.

b. Quantities of gravel taken shall be determined by survey provided by Phillips Petroleum Company at their cost.

c. Payment shall be based on \$0.50/cu. yd. with a deposit of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) due prior to entry on the land. Balance to be paid at completion of extraction.

d. Permit schedule shall begin upon signing of documents and end May 31, 1985.

e. That Phillips Petroleum Co. shall, at its expense, obtain any and all necessary permits from state or federal agencies.

f. That Phillips Petroleum Co. leaves the property in a safe condition.

g. That extraction must not close off the use of the right-of-way by other persons unless temporary alternative access is provided by Phillips Petroleum Co.

Section 2. That the Mayor is authorized to sign such documents as are required to effectuate this lease.
