KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH  
RESOLUTION 85-116 (AMENDED)

PROVIDING FOR A BALLOT PROPOSITION FOR AN ADVISORY VOTE ON THE FUNDING OF THE 911 EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM ON A BOROUGH-WIDE BASIS.

WHEREAS, the Borough is empowered by state statute to fund and operate a borough-wide 911 emergency communication system; and

WHEREAS, the fact that this power is granted by state statute absolutely precludes the assembly from giving the voters any binding authority to decide whether the borough should continue to fund the 911 program; and

WHEREAS, despite this statutory authorization the assembly feels that an advisory vote of the people should be had for consideration in future funding of the 911 program;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That an advisory proposition shall be placed upon the ballot of the next regular borough election, October 1, 1985, to be voted on by all registered borough voters, as follows:

ADVISORY PROPOSITION - THIS PROPOSITION IS SOLELY ADVISORY AND IS NOT BINDING UPON THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH.
