RESOLUTION 85-147

REQUESTING THE STATE OF ALASKA TO MATCH EVERY DOLLAR SPENT ENCOURAGING TOURISM WITH FUNDING FOR VISITOR FACILITIES.

WHEREAS, the State of Alaska spends several million dollars a year encouraging tourists to visit Alaska; and

WHEREAS, the State of Alaska spends substantially less on visitor facilities; and


WHEREAS, the lack of sufficient visitor facilities has impacted many Kenai Peninsula property owners, whose property is trespassed upon and damaged by the overflow of tourists seeking facilities;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the assembly hereby recommends that every dollar spent encouraging tourism be matched by a dollar spent improving old visitor facilities or constructing new visitor facilities within the state.

Section 2. That the clerk is directed to distribute copies of this resolution to the Governor of Alaska; Alaska State Senators Paul Fisher, Jalmar Kerttula, Edna DeVries and John Sackett; and to Alaska State Representatives Mike Navarre, Andre Marrou, Bette Cato, Mike Szymanski and Kay Wallis.
