## RESOLUTION 85-152

ESTABLISHING ASSEMBLY POLICY TO TAKE NO POSITION WITH REGARD TO ISSUANCE OF RESTAURANT OR EATING PLACE LIQUOR LICENSE APPLICATIONS.

WHEREAS, Alaska Statutes and regulations pertaining to liquor license applications provide for opportunity of the local assembly to protest; and

WHEREAS, recently liquor license laws have changed so that issuance of licenses is based on borough wide population outside cities rather than within five mile radiuses; and

WHEREAS, there are five or fewer licenses which would be available without special exceptions for restaurant and eating place licenses under the new statutes; and

WHEREAS, the assembly does not feel it is in the Borough's best interest to be considering protests which might have the effect of giving one person or another a particular advantage over the few remaining available licenses for restaurant and eating place establishments;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the assembly hereby adopts a policy that it will not consider or lodge a protest against the application of a restaurant or eating place liquor license within the Kenai Peninsula Borough except where such protest is made for delinquency in filing or nonpayment of taxes in accordance with Alaska Statute and Borough policy or ordinances.

Section 2. That this resolution takes effect immediately upon its adoption.
