URGING THE USE OF TIMBER FROM THE BRADLEY LAKE PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the Alaska Power Authority is proceeding with the development of the Bradley Lake power project; and

WHEREAS, this development will involve the clearance and removal of timber in rights-of-way in the project site itself; and

WHEREAS, much of the timber to be removed is of high quality and could be best used for cabin logs and lumber; and

WHEREAS, the assembly feels that failure to use this timber for its best use would be a waste; and

WHEREAS, there are persons in the area and state capable of harvesting the timber for use as construction materials; and

WHEREAS, there will be a number of facilities built for the project in which this timber could be used; and

WHEREAS, the remnant timber could be made available for firewood;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the assembly of the Kenai Peninsula Borough urges the State of Alaska and the Alaska Power Authority to arrange for clearing of rights-of-way and sites for the Bradley Lake project to be conducted in such a manner that the usable timber is harvested and where possible such logs and lumbers should be used in the construction of facilities for the project itself.

Section 2. That copies of this resolution shall be sent to Governor William Sheffield, our legislative contingent, Director of the Alaska Power Authority.
