RESOLUTION 86-2

URGING THE STATE OF ALASKA, OLDER ALASKANS COMMISSION, OFFICIALLY RECOGNIZE THE SOLDOTNA AREA SENIOR CITIZENS, INC. AND RESPOND FAVORABLY TO THE GROUP'S FUNDING REQUEST.

WHEREAS, the Soldotna Area Senior Citizens, Inc. is a newly formed nonprofit organization of the State of Alaska; and

WHEREAS, there are in excess of 457 senior citizens of the greater Soldotna, Kalifornsky, Ridgeway, and Sterling area; and

WHEREAS, voters of the Kenai Peninsula Borough recently indicated support for funding of senior citizen programs; and

WHEREAS, the group of volunteers who formed Soldotna Area Senior Citizens, Inc. have applied to the State of Alaska Older Alaskans Commission; and

WHEREAS, Title III grant monies may be available to the Soldotna Area Senior Citizens, Inc. for hot meal services and homebound delivery of hot meals if they are officially recognized by the State of Alaska Older Alaskans Commission; and

WHEREAS, Soldotna Area Senior Citizens, Inc. has applied for funding from Title III grant monies;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly urges the State of Alaska to officially recognize the activities and goals of the Soldotna Area Senior Citizens, Inc.


Section 2. That the Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly requests that the Older Alaskans Commission act favorably on a funding request submitted to them by the Soldotna Area Senior Citizens, Inc.

Section 3. That copies of this resolution be sent to all agencies and persons who are directly involved with seniors programs and to Jon Wolfe, Executive Director, and Peggy Burgin, Chairperson, of the Older Alaskans Commission.

Section 4. That this resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
