KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH

RESOLUTION 86-114

DESIGNATING SEPTEMBER 1986 AS "SIGN AMNESTY MONTH".

WHEREAS, approximately 150-250 borough road signs are missing; and

WHEREAS, such road signs are essential to all emergency services providers in the borough for the provision of life saving services; and

WHEREAS, replacement costs for the road signs could be as high as \$85 per sign; and

WHEREAS, AS 11.46.100 and 11.46.120-150 provide for criminal penalties that may be applied to the taking of road signs; and


WHEREAS, it is desirable to provide a period of amnesty so that sign takers can return signs to the borough, thereby saving replacement costs and potentially saving lives;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:


Section 1. That September 1986 be designated as "Sign Amnesty Month", and the mayor is authorized to take appropriate action to effectuate this resolution.

Section 2. That this resolution takes effect immediately upon its adoption.
